



This is the true story of St. Albert Chmielowski, a celebrated Polish artist and painter in the 1800's who was a major inspiration for young Karol Wojtyla, later Pope John Paul II. Albert became dissatisfied with his painting and disillusioned about the meaning of life when he encountered many homeless and outcast beggars in Poland; these encounters triggered his passion to help the poor. He gave up his promising painting career, and became a monk who served the poor for the rest of his life. He founded a new religious community that would come to be known as the Albertine Brothers and later, the Albertine Sisters.

This movie is based on a play Karol Wojtyla wrote as a tribute to his love for St. Albert and his inspiration for Wojtyla in discerning his own vocation to give up acting and enter the priesthood. When he became the Pope, he said that anyone who wanted to understand his views should study his plays, and on the topic of social justice, to study Our God's Brother. Wojtyla described the play not as a drama but a work of "inner theater," an attempt to penetrate the inner mystery of man. It is less driven by action than by interior monologues and intellectual dialogues that are more philosophical than psychological.

The tension in the film isn't just between art and God. There is also the tension between the many poor and the wealthy few; between the two forms of solidarity, Christian brotherhood and Marxism. Wojtyla's personality and philosophical views on man, faith, and life are revealed through Albert's monologues with himself and the conversations with others about the meaning of art and man.

Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time ***Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson***

“Legalese puts me ill at ease.” That little ditty is my own creation, with the point that the language found in many a legal document that strives to be specific tends rather to be soporific. Reading a statement like “Whereas the party of the first part, herein referred to as ‘X’ can impact the party of the second part, herein referred to as ‘Y’, with intimations of motivation proffered as real which in fact remains dubious, if not false, and also tend to be counterproductive for the manifest purpose of the specified case...” I guarantee that you will begin to nod off. Consequently we are glad to pay our lawyer’s fee just to read such verbiage and translate for us.

In the time of Our Lord, long before pen on paper was available to most people, and speech was the only medium of exchange of ideas, a good teacher had to use a special talent to get and keep the audience’s attention. Our Lord, the Master teacher, made it look easy, St. Mark underscored this when he wrote what we hear today: “With many such parables He (Jesus) spoke the word to them as they were able to understand it.”

Even we, as modern listeners to Jesus, jaded as we may be by being talked at by teleprompter readers of hired actors parroting for yet another product we don’t really need, we can relate to a lesson of what a small seed planted can produce.

Mark augments that parable with the preceding one Jesus told about the power of the land to yield fruit.

The Lord tells His first listeners and us that this is the way it is for God’s kingdom. It is not a physical place, but a community of God’s friends living His way. Church history chronicles how the Catholic Church has grown to embrace billions, even though it sprang from an unremarkable band of Twelve. This growth, fertilized and watered by the Holy Spirit, is only still here by His willing it. What has kept it alive ultimately traces back to God’s design. The proof is in that very history, which could be called at times a record of human folly.


The prophet Ezekiel’s image of a tender shoot planted atop a cedar on a high mountain, and Jesus’ picture of a tiny mustard seed planted in the earth tell us both of God’s power and our own worth in His eyes. Each of us is an integral part of God’s grand design, and Faith in Him helps us to believe it. We make a big mistake placing our faith elsewhere. But our cooperation with God can bring about something truly wonderful.

Sir Donald Malcolm Campbell, the British car and boat-racer and holder of several world speed records, lost his life while racing a fast boat on one of the lakes of Scotland. The boat exploded and rapidly sank. The only thing that ever surfaced was a toy stuffed animal, Campbell’s alleged “good luck charm.” The toy was powerless to help him in the final and fatal crisis of his life.

Very realistically, and in clear easy to understand language, there is no better demonstration of faith than a person planting seed in a field. God love you, and give you His peace.
