

The Second Week of Lent

We continue the first part of Lent, during which we learn, along with those preparing for Baptism, wonderful lessons in our faith. We can feel the rhythm developing. Sunday is always our celebration of the Lord's resurrection, and establishes our theme for the week. Wednesdays and Fridays remind us of our commitment to a change of heart. Monday, Tuesday and Thursday re-introduce us to wonderful scriptures for our journey. Saturday is always uplifting and joyful. The Opening Prayer of the Liturgy each day continues to guide our prayer. As we experience how simple these prayers are, and how easy they are to make our own, we find ourselves praying together in the same Spirit, with one another on this journey, around the world.

Lenten Patterns: Eating

Lent is a great time to change our eating patterns. This is not about "losing weight" or "getting in shape," though for most of us, paying attention to what we eat, will make a difference in our overall health. This is about being more alert. Anyone who has tried to diet knows that something changes in us when we try to avoid eating. The whole purpose of fasting is to aid prayer - to make it easier to listen to God more openly, especially in times of need. The other powerful advantage of fasting is that it can be a very simple gesture that puts us in greater solidarity with the poor of the earth, who often have very little more than a little rice and beans each day. Powerful things happen, when we think about those people in the world who have so much less than we do. And, it's a great cure for self-pity.

Second Sunday of Lent

Reflection by Rev. Leonard N. Peterson

Sooner rather than later a young person setting out on their future realizes that connections count. For instance, having a parent with a famous name in a certain field automatically gives "a leg up" to his son or daughter.

In a certain sense the same applies to any of us seeking a closer union with Christ. Through our baptism, our parents brought us to the front and right then and there established a connection with Christ. All that's left for us to do is to keep it alive and healthy. But that's easier said than done.

Even though Abram (later Abraham) preceded the institution of the sacrament of Baptism, his wholehearted "yes" to the Lord's "marching orders" to leave his home to settle someplace else was nearly equivalent. He stayed connected to his God. He found a certain inner peace in knowing that he cooperated with God's plan. He not only became "the father of many nations" but also "our Father in Faith" as the First Eucharistic prayer asserts.

Jesus also left His "native place" in heaven in obedience to His heavenly Father. He thus became connected to us as the subject of our faith while still remaining connected to the Father.

In this remarkable story of the Transfiguration, proclaimed to us this weekend, we have a perfect illustration of how the divine connection persists. It is the Bible at its best, with a gospel message of encouragement, as we strive through our Lenten penance to upgrade and enhance our connection to Christ.

The "wiring" of our connection may have frayed by how we have lived spiritually since last Easter. So the Church presents us with Lent and this story right at the early part of the season to make the necessary repairs. There is an ancient tradition which held that the Transfiguration of Jesus happened 40 days before Good Friday. At any rate, the event reminds us why and for whom we pray, fast, and give alms during this significant season.

We can face up to our failures and try to make amends. We can change for the better with God's help. We can be calm and courageous while all around us is the swirling chaos of a world that ignores Christ. Staying connected with Him is the one way that will enable us one fine but unknown day to look at the smiling Face of Jesus. Then each of us might well borrow from St. Peter's reaction and say: "Lord, it's good for me to be here!"

Say the Word

"You're up in front, so when you genuflect, even if your legs are hurting, you are helping everyone else in the Church to remember to genuflect. This is a little sacrifice we can make to thank Jesus for the sacrifice He made for us on the Cross." The looks on their faces told me they were "feeling the burn" of genuflecting while we practiced for the Stations of the Cross.

When we enter a Catholic Church and genuflect towards the tabernacle, we do so in honor of Christ the King, truly present in the Blessed Sacrament. He stays there in the tabernacle so that we can come and visit Him and so that He can be taken out to the sick who are unable to come to Him in the Church. The small signs of reverence that we make as Catholics are a powerful teaching tool for both visitors and the young. Genuflecting, kneeling when the tabernacle is open, speaking quietly in the Church, etc. - show that we believe Jesus is truly present in our Church. This is a lesson worth passing on.

Prayers for PREP

Jesus Eucharistic, we pray that the children in our PREP program, and especially our Level 2 students, know, believe in and experience the True Presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. Amen.
