## **PENTECOST SUNDAY- May 23, 2021**

Today is Pentecost Sunday, the birthday of the Church. Originally a Jewish feast observed fifty days after Passover; Pentecost celebrated the grape harvest and the giving of the covenant at Sinai. Pentecost became a Christian celebration because of the descent of the Holy Spirit upon the disciples gathered in the Upper Room fifty days after Easter. At this first Pentecost after the resurrection and ascension of Jesus, as recorded in the Acts of the Apostles, the Holy Spirit was manifested as a divine Person to the Church sent to fulfill the paschal mystery of Christ as He had promised.

At the same time on this feast, the Holy Spirit manifested the Church to the world through the preaching of St. Peter the Apostle. St. Peter's first sermon explained the meaning of the event and called those who listened to conversion to Christ by accepting baptism, with the result that three thousand were converted that day. Ever since that day, the Holy Spirit has been guiding the work of the Church and is inspiring the work of the new evangelization—sharing the good news of God's love to strengthen the believers and calling others to faith in Christ.

### **A Few Changes and Updates at St. Charles Borromeo Rectory**
