### OUR BENEFICIARIES

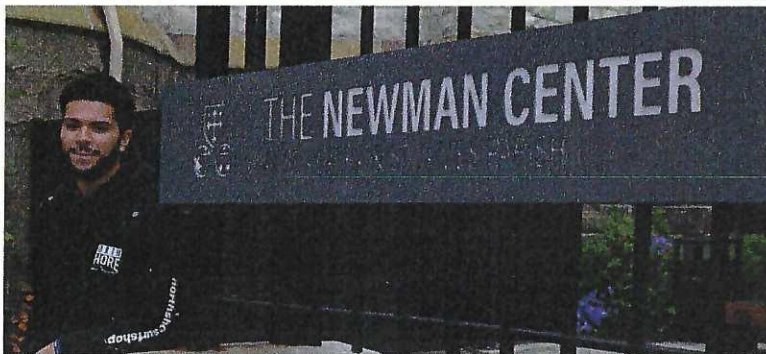
